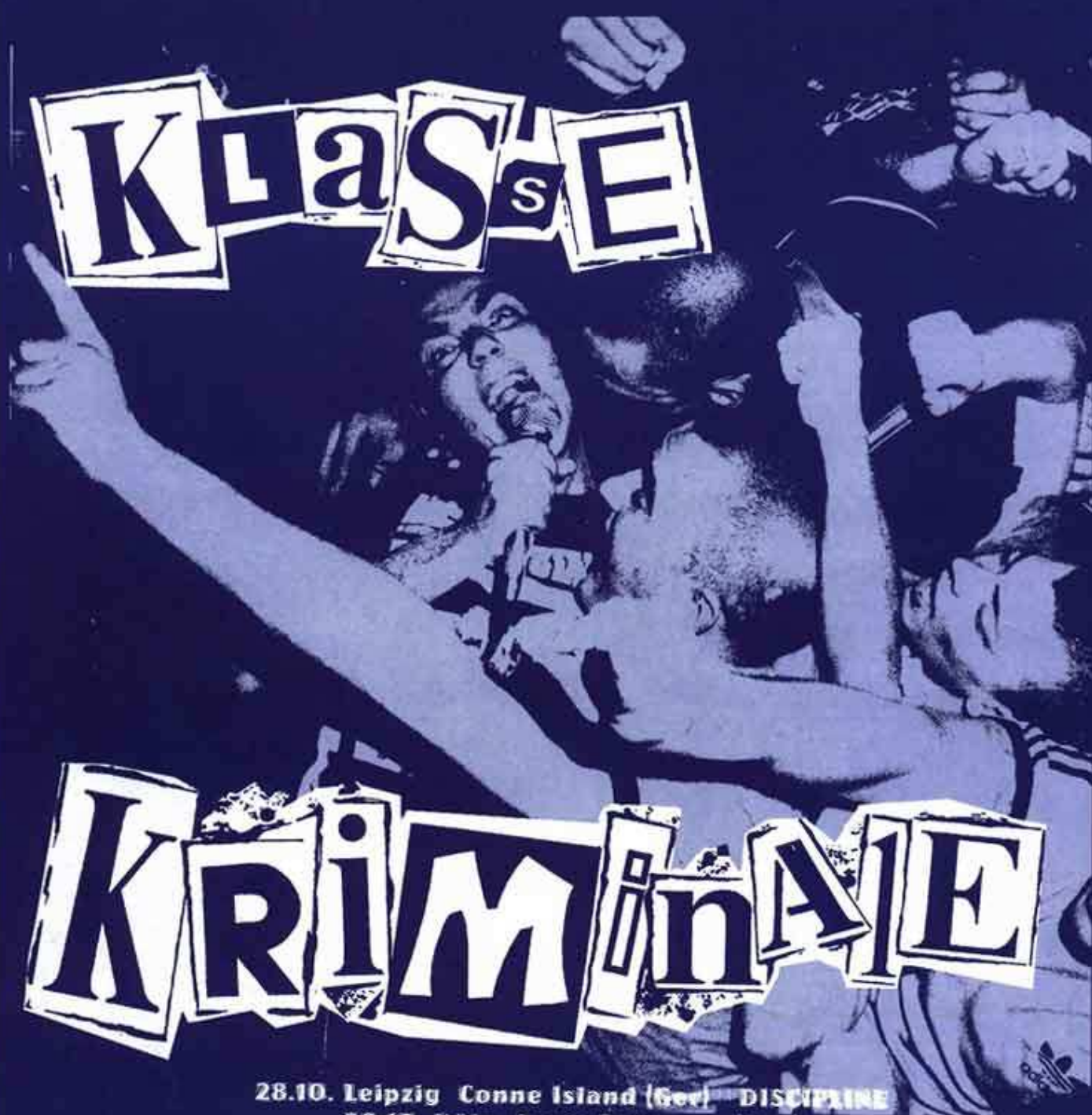

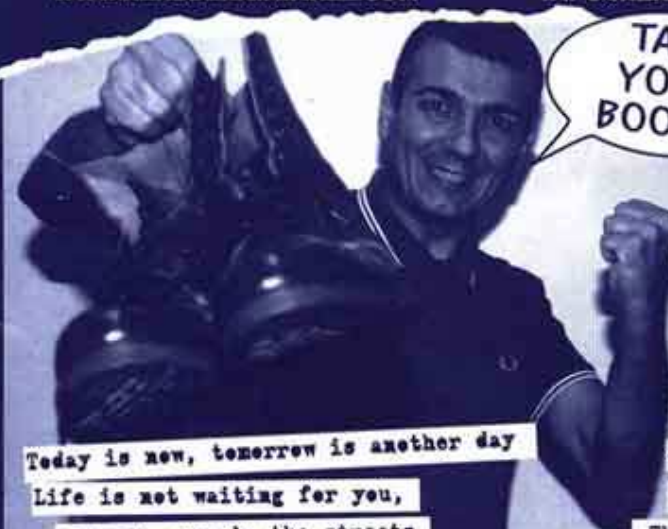

I am listening to the new Klasse Kriminale album in my car, the winding road takes me to Marce Balestrino's house. We've known each other for twenty years and when I enter the door there's no need to stand on ceremony. The shelves on every wall are full of vinyls, fanzines, books, videos and small gadgets collected over the years. But it's not a museum, it's not a collection of memorabilia to witness what Marce was before. I can bet that if I come back here in two days I will find new things piled up on the old ones, newly released CDs waiting to be listened to, postal packages with exotic stamps next to printed out e-mails. I am not in the "Punk Gallery", the clock marks 2005.

Today is new, tomorrow is another day
Life is not waiting for you,
come on, run in the streets
Still a Punk in the street
Still a Skin in your Heart
(from "Skunk" Klasse Kriminale 2005)

This is the tenth album by Klasse Kriminale, without taking into account the many Best Of's and reissues around the world. Marce explains. I wonder why the latest album is self-titled. «Only these two words - Marce says - could have summarised what we are, our growth as a band and especially our roots». In the last few albums the lyrics focused more on personal issues, on the relationship between the pressures of the modern world and its problems. In the new album there are answers; how to draw the line. The solution is to be what one has always been, no mediation and no compromise. WE ARE SKINHEADS & PUNKS!! «This is a mediocre world, where creativity and talent are suppressed, where you'd rather not disturb and please other people than please yourself.» Marce comments.

Some people say that the Real Punk movement in Italy is finished, without any enthusiasm left. Instead, Marce asks himself how many really believed in it: «Have you ever lived your life? Have you ever believed in one band? There are best boys in Italy and the movement can still develop. The solution is to get out of general mediocrity. It's not worth it to be content with drinking cheap beer and listening to songs with the word "hate" in every line. More style, our style, the style of the streets!» Marce and I have often discussed these kinds of issues, sometimes dozing off at night in a motorway station, sometimes waiting for a ship to arrive at the docks. I wonder now - a quarter of a century since "Oi! The album" was released - what remains of this magic mix with a cheeky name which brought together the most disturbing and less aligned subcultures of the last years: Skinheads and Punks.

From the intelligence of the people and their rejection of a system which is wrong. We have a world to conquer, let's not waste time! "Spacca tutte" (Break Everything!), "Fuggi Via" (Get Away), "NOi!" (We!), "Make Love & Make War" this is what the album says. The album has been recorded with the collaboration of

Vic Ruggiere responsible for

the 2-Tone vibes in "Cerri



Cerri" (Hurry Hurry) and "Anarchia Liberta'"

(Anarchy Freedom). It was recorded at the

West Link studio owned by Alessandro "Ovi"

Spertelli and Alessandro Paelucci,

two old hands of Made in Italy Punk.

Spertelli was working with the "Grand

Ducato Hardcore" scene, and Paelucci

was the bassplayer of the Raw Power. Lars Frederiksen from Rancid suggested to Marce that the new

album should be mastered in Jeff King's studios in Los Angeles. The sound is Oi! but adapted to

the third millennium! With Football Terrace cheruses, anthems to scream out loud in the underground,

in the corridors of the schools, for a breather in prison. According to a survey conducted by

Rolling Stones magazine, Klasse Kriminale is the favourite band - for its music and its lyrics-

VIDEOS:

So far, Klasse Kriminale have shot three videos for their new album "Klasse Kriminale".

"SKUNK" - the first one - includes the images of a tour in Germany and other concerts in Bologna (Teste Veste Ossa Rette Festival), Florence

(at the CPA squat) and Geneva (Rude Boys Unity Festival). It features in the Italian

and German editions of the album. The second video is "DIO E CON NOI". It is a satire on the image of "super president" Bush and it features in the French and Argentina editions of the album. "SPACCA TUTTO" is the third video and it was shot in the club "Miglie Verde" (Green Miles) which is managed by a social cooperative of detainees of the S. Agostino Prison in Savona. The video will be released in the single CD called "SPACCA TUTTO". The videos were shot by France and Fulvia Resse, the editing has been carried out with the collaboration of Amanda Cirle.

16 tracks, produced by Vic Ruggiere from the Slackers and mastered by Jeff King at Threshold Sound & Vision Studios of Los Angeles: classic Punk songs such as "Fuggi Via" (Get Away), "Make Love & Make War" and "Noi!" (We!); Hardcore explosions "Spacca Tutto" (Break Everything!); the anti-Bush song "Dio E' Con Noi" (God Is With Us); overwhelming Ska tracks: the Punky "Anarchia Liberta'" (Anarchy Freedom) and "Cerri Cerri" (Run Run), a traditional 2-Tone style song; and the anthem "Lere" (Them), containing a reusing version of "Police And Thieves". Different editions of the album were released in Italy (TUBE RECORDS), France (SOLITUDE URBAIN), Germany/Austria (DSS) and Argentina (AMP), all with different artwork, bonus live tracks and videos. The album is available on CD, complete with an 8 page booklet including lyrics. It is also available as a deluxe digi-pak with a 16 page booklet.

Klasse Kriminale entered the Italian Indie Chart, and in a Rolling Stone poll conducted in the San Vittore Prison in Milan, "Klasse Kriminale" was chosen by the prisoners as one of their favourite albums.
